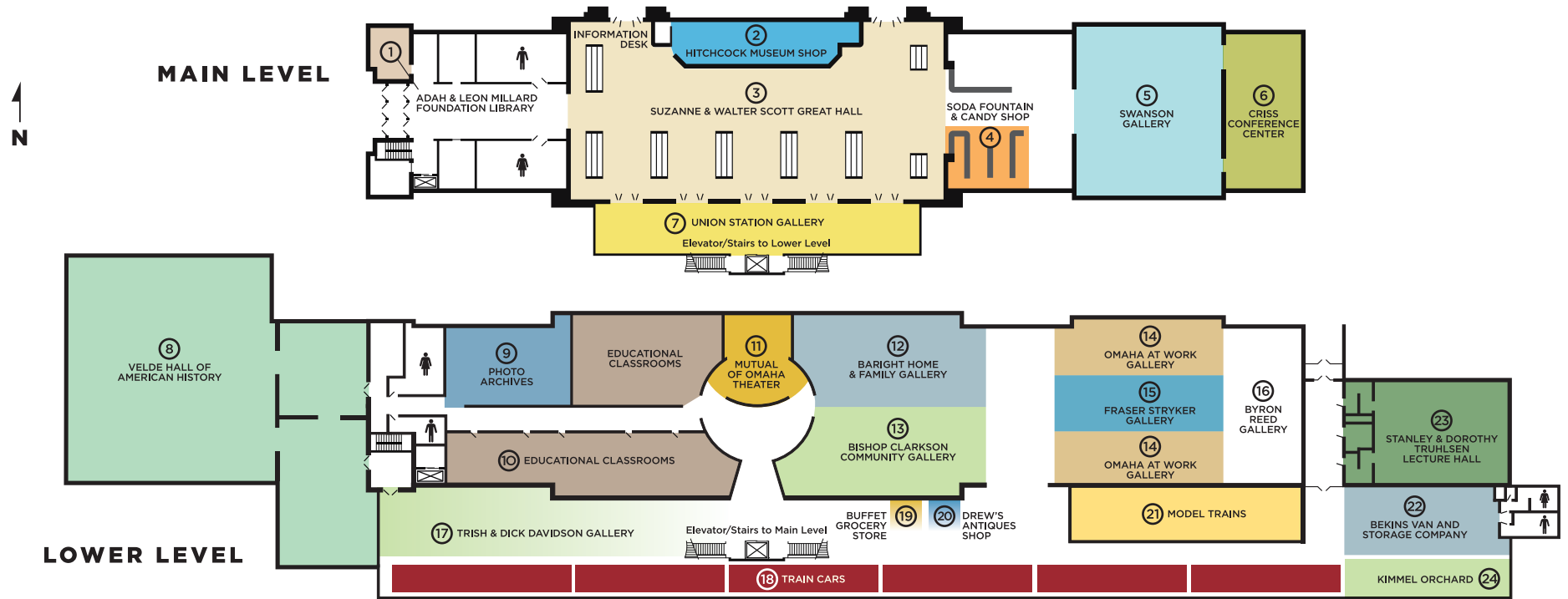


THE DURHAM MUSEUM FLOOR PLAN



1 ADAH & LEON MILLARD FOUNDATION LIBRARY
The Millard Library and Resource Center offers a comprehensive collection of books related to the history of Omaha and the West. The library is open on Saturday and by appointment. Please call 402-444-5071.

2 HITCHCOCK MUSEUM SHOP
Visit the Hitchcock Gift Shop in the Suzanne & Walter Scott Great Hall for unique gifts and souvenirs.

3 SUZANNE & WALTER SCOTT GREAT HALL
Admire the beautifully restored art deco architecture and eavesdrop on the lives of people who traveled through the station in the 1930s, '40s and '50s.

4 SODA FOUNTAIN & CANDY SHOP
Your adventure won't be complete without a trip to the authentic 1931 soda fountain ... with sundaes, malts and sodas served the old-fashioned way — hand-clipped! Be sure to stop by the Candy Shop for a special treat.

5 SWANSON GALLERY
Elegant Swanson Gallery was once the Hayden House Restaurant, a grand dining room in Union Station. Today it is used for special events and can be rented for private functions.

6 CRISS CONFERENCE CENTER
The Criss Conference Center has its own catering area, multi-media equipment, restrooms and separate entrance, and can be rented for private meetings.

7 UNION STATION GALLERY
"Through These Doors: The History of Omaha's Union Station" is an extraordinary exhibit that provides visitors with the rich history of Omaha's Union Station.

8 VELDE HALL OF AMERICAN HISTORY
Opened in 2004, the 12,500-square-foot Velde Hall of American History is where you will find our temporary exhibits on display.

9 PHOTO ARCHIVES
Our Photo Archives contain over 500,000 images relating to the history of Omaha with emphasis on eight special collections. The collections are open to the public Tuesday - Friday and by special appointment. For information call (402) 444-5087.

10 EDUCATIONAL CLASSROOMS
Children explore our world in unique educational settings through classes and scouting programs that serve thousands of children each year.

11 MUTUAL OF OMAHA THEATER
Start your visit with a film presentation showing the development of Omaha from the mid-1800s to today.

12 BARIHGT HOME & FAMILY GALLERY
See how families lived in Omaha in the 1800s through history.

13 BISHOP CLARKSON COMMUNITY GALLERY
Explore architecture, education, medical care, religion, immigration, parks and the arts in Omaha's development.

14 OMAHA AT WORK GALLERY
Discover why Omaha was founded and how the city grew.

15 FRASER STRYKER GALLERY
The Fraser Stryker Trans-Mississippi Centennial Gallery celebrates the Trans-Mississippi Exposition and its impact on the city.

16 BYRON REED GALLERY
Examine rare coins and documents from one of the top three collections of its kind in the U.S.

17 TRISH & DICK DAVIDSON GALLERY
The Trish & Dick Davidson Gallery explores the history of transportation and commerce throughout the years.

18 TRAIN CARS
Step inside the train cars to experience railroad travel — in the steam engine, Pullman Car, lounge car and caboose.

19 BUFFETT GROCERY STORE
Shop for groceries at the Buffet Grocery Store. This exhibit features a replica storefront of the original that opened in 1915.

20 DREW'S ANTIQUES SHOP
This exhibit features some of the finest antiques from the museum's collection.

21 MODEL TRAINS
Don't miss the 100-foot-long O-scale model train layout representing Union Pacific's double track main line during the 1950s.

22 BEKINS VAN & STORAGE COMPANY
Explore the history of an early Omaha family-based business. This exhibit includes an original delivery truck, household furniture, photographs and more.

23 STANLEY & DOROTHY TRUHLSEN LECTURE HALL
This facility combines the museum's architectural history with state-of-the-art technology to bring to Omaha intriguing presenters from the Smithsonian, Library of Congress and others.

24 KIMMEL ORCHARD
This area commemorates the history of the Kimmel Orchard in Nebraska City, using a beautiful hand-painted mural, a two-story farmhouse façade, and replica apple trees.
